Assistant City Manager

- Attended the annual International City/County Managers Association conference, and will be sharing with staff information on performance measurement, technology planning, and communications.
- Has been meeting with department directors and staff to discuss the new Strategic Plan and the Action Plan. Department directors are working with their staff to review and update performance measures.
- The City Operations Sustainability Plan will be on the October 20 Worksession. Please contact Bill Gardiner, Assistant City Manager bgardiner@collegetparkmd.gov if you have questions or suggestions for changes.
- Working with the UMD PALS program and a possible course in the spring at no cost to the City. The course would focus on recommendations from the Greenhouse Gas Emissions report, the City's Action Plan projects, or actions from the City Operations Sustainability Plan.

City Clerk

- The City Clerk's office is preparing for the November 3 election. The plan is to have two "Express Vote" machines – one at each polling location – for visually impaired voters. We were able to accomplish this within the \$15,000 authorized by Council by reducing the number of DS200s from four to three at each poll location. Finance

- This week, the Finance department will be issuing applications for the FY2016 community services grants. These grants are for a maximum of \$2,500 and the eligible organizations are described in the grant criteria. Any organization that receives a direct grant or community events micro-grant from the City is not eligible for these grants. The deadline for submission of applications is Thursday, November 5. Grant applications and criteria will be sent to previous grant recipients and posted on the City's website ([click here](#)).
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Human Resources

- Jessica Prentice from Youth and Family Services won Employee of the Quarter for September 2015.
 - Awards Ceremony will be held on December 11, 2015. Please make plans to attend.
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Planning

- The *Business Beat* will be back in circulation starting this week and then will publish on alternate months with the Development Update which will be released in early November. Look for the opening of Nando's Peri Peri on October 28 preceded by a soft opening with all proceeds donated to the University of Maryland Community Food Bank. Also check out the mural now being painted on an exterior wall facing Knox Road by South African artist Kilmany-Jo Liversage.
 - Staff attended a session held by MML and MACo to discuss zoning issues associated with establishing medical marijuana facilities in Maryland. Planning has received several inquiries from applicants wishing to open dispensaries in College Park. Initially, the State will license 94 dispensaries (two per senatorial district). The deadline for applications is November 6, 2015.
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Public Services

The following are highlights of Public Services activity this past week, which also included routine issuing of permits, conducting exterior property maintenance inspections, patrol, and code/law enforcement activities:

- Code Enforcement staff conducted 42 annual rental inspections of single family and condo units; six fraternities were inspected. One business inspection was conducted.
- From 5 pm on Thursday, October 8th through Sunday October 11th, the night and weekend shifts of Code Enforcement and Contract Police Officers responded to 8 noise or loud party complaints. Warnings were issued when no noise code violations were documented, and two (2) Municipal Infractions (\$500 fines) were issued when sound levels were measured over the code limits. Sponsors of all events were advised of the noise ordinance and were directed to quiet any disturbing noise. Two (2) UMD students were referred to the Office of Student Conduct as the result of party complaints.
- Contract Police responded and assisted at two (2) incidents involving UMD students who were transported to the hospital. One was for a pedestrian struck in the crosswalk at Baltimore Ave & Knox

Road, the other was for a possible overdose in an off campus apartment building. Both injuries were believed to be not life threatening.

- The Animal Control Officer impounded 3 stray cats, returned 1 cat to owner, and disposed of 3 cat carcasses found deceased.
 - Staff have been providing support for a community wetlands cleanup event to be held 9am-12noon, Saturday, October 17, at the wetlands between Columbia Ave and the CSX tracks. Volunteers will meet at Columbia Ave. tot lot near College Ave.
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Public Works

- This Saturday, October 17, is the last of the two fall Cleanup Saturdays. DPW, 9217 51st Avenue, will be open from 7:30 am to 12:00 noon for city residents, with proof of residency, to drop-off bulky trash, electronics, brush and yard waste. Hazardous materials (shingles, propane tanks, paint, etc.) will not be accepted. Selected donation of clothing and household items and building, remodeling, and gardening materials will be collected by vendors.  - Last Saturday, October 10, 44 residents took advantage of the shredding program and 35 residents dropped off electronics for recycling.

Proposal to Implement Residential Permit Restricted parking in the 5200 block of Mineola Road

The Mayor and Council of the City of College Park will hold a Public Hearing to take public comment on the possibility of implementing a new Residential Permit Parking Zone in the 5200 block of Mineola Road. This proposed new permit restricted zone would be enforced 24/7, and would allow two (2) parking permits per residence, at the cost of \$10 per year per permit. Guest permits will also involve a fee.

All persons interested shall have an opportunity to be heard. Parking passes will be available from the front window. Route 1 Evening Road Closures – Monument Village At College Park West

Starting Sunday, October 11, 2015, Davis Construction Corp. will be starting the work associated with installing the incoming Domestic Water Service for the property. The overall operation is anticipated to take two (2) weeks.

The incoming water service is fed from a water main which is situated below the furthest outbound lane of US Route 1 (Baltimore Avenue). As a result, selective lane closures will be required to complete the installation and tie-in. Due to the high volume of traffic on US Route 1, Maryland State Highway Authority (MDSHA) and the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission (WSSC) are advising that this work be performed during off-peak hours. The specific working hours have been identified below;

Work Hours: Working hours for this operation will take place Sunday – Thursday, between the hours of 8:00PM and 6:00AM.

All work is taking place along US Route 1 and will not interfere with normal traffic patterns along Cherokee Street, or Autoville Drive. Additionally, this will not disrupt the water service for the community, or any of the surrounding neighborhoods. It should be noted that there will be personnel from James G. Davis Construction onsite at all times while this work is ongoing.

Attick Towers will open its' wait list from November 2, 2015 to November 20, 2015. Attick Towers is an independent living high-rise apartment building located at 9014 Rhode Island Avenue in College Park, Maryland.

All applicants must be 62 years of age or older or be a disabled or handicapped adult. Applicants do not have to reside in College Park to apply; however, people who live or work in the City of College Park will have preference. No children can be accepted. Applicants are subject to a credit and criminal background check.

Applicants should be prepared to move within 30 days once a unit is available. Rent is based on 30 percent of one's income. Attick Towers has efficiency apartments for one person occupancy and one bedroom apartments for two person occupancy. All applicants are required to pay a security deposit equal to one month's rent or \$300, whichever is less.





New to You: Fall Conference Orientation for Municipal Officials – October 26

As the fall conference roster grows, so does the number of officials attending that are new to office or new to participating in League events. We welcome all new officials or those veteran officials who are unfamiliar with League programs and benefits, to attend the Orientation for Municipal Officials (OMO) being held Monday, October 26 1:00-2:00 p.m. during the fall conference.

OMOs are designed to provide a 50,000 foot view of League benefits and programs. MML's Leadership and staff will be on hand to discuss:

- How certain League programs can save precious municipal dollars
- MML's legislative advocacy
- How to best take advantage of League membership

Kick off your fall conference experience at the OMO, then visit the tabletop exhibits to gather information on a broad variety of goods and services that your municipality may need.

Legislative Committee to Recommend 2016 Priorities to League Membership at Fall Conference

In its meeting on September 23, the MML Legislative Committee discussed twelve legislative action requests submitted from League members. For the 2016 General Assembly session, the Committee decided to recommend two legislative priorities and three statements of strategic engagement to be voted upon by the general membership at this year's fall conference in Cambridge.

For the seventh year in a row, the Committee decided that advocating for the restoration of highway user revenues should be a top League priority. The Committee endorsed a commitment to work with the General Assembly and administration to restore these important transportation funds and to ensure predictable, stable funding into the future.

The Committee also recommended that the League actively oppose any effort to divert Program Open Space (POS) funds from their intended purpose to the general fund. In past years, the General Assembly has balanced the general fund on the back of the POS program, to the detriment of local governments. MML will join with other stakeholders in this important program to advocate against continued fund diversions.

The Committee will also be working on three statements of strategic engagement regarding foreclosures, tax equity, and police body cameras. The statements will commit the League to support local government interests on these issues before the General Assembly during the upcoming legislative session.

Fall Conference Update

With the 2015 MML fall conference fast approaching, attendees will have a range of workshop topics to choose from, including three core Academy classes (Structure of Municipal Government, Open Meetings, and Municipal Budgeting.) Additional workshops include Hot Button Legal Issues, Lobbying 101, Environmental Awareness, and Dealing with Blighted and Foreclosed Properties. Although discounted early registration has closed, [online registration](#) is still available until October 16 and first-time attendees qualify for a \$50 discount. Maryland's Attorney General Brian Frosh is confirmed as the keynote speaker during the business meeting on Friday, October 27 at 1:30 p.m., where he will discuss policing issues in Maryland. Maryland Governor Larry Hogan and Lt. Governor Boyd Rutherford are also invited speakers. Municipal Policing "Bonus" Workshop

There have been few moments in recent history when policing has faced greater scrutiny than it has in the past two years. A confluence of tragic events, technological advances, and cultural, demographic and political shifts have forced elected officials, police, and the communities we serve to rethink how we conduct public safety operations. Join MML on **Wednesday, October 28** from 1-4:30 p.m. – immediately after the fall conference – at the Cambridge Public Safety Building for a timely conversation titled "*Walking the Beat: The Future of Municipal Policing.*" This class qualifies for Academy for Excellence in Local Governance Elective credit, and everyone who registers before October 10 will receive a package of supplementary pre-workshop materials.

MML Conference Proxies and Absentee Ballots Available

Proxy [forms](#) and absentee ballot information were e-mailed in September to each MML member municipality. Both offer alternatives to cities and towns that will otherwise not be represented at the League fall conference business meeting in Cambridge on October 27, 2015.

If elected officials from a League member municipality are unable to attend the conference, their municipality may be represented for voting purposes by administrative proxy (if a nonelected official from your municipality will represent your city/town) or municipal proxy (if a representative from another municipality will represent your city/town). Note that a MML member municipality may exercise a municipal proxy for just one other member municipality.

Absentee ballots, which are provided on request, provide a limited voice for those who choose not to use a proxy. Absentee ballots may be used only to vote yea or nay on (1) the issues recommended for inclusion in the League's legislative package and (2) any MML bylaws amendments that are considered at the conference.

Public Works Mutual Aid Agreement

If your city or town has not yet signed the state's Municipal Public Works Mutual Aid Agreement, please consider doing so at a council meeting this fall. We know from La Plata's catastrophic tornado and a variety of local emergencies that have occurred since then, that municipalities are always quick to assist each other in a time of crisis. However, FEMA and MEMA regulations can limit your jurisdiction's ability to receive reimbursement for such assistance unless your municipality has a signed mutual aid agreement with the city or town you are assisting.

To date, the following cities and towns have signed the agreement along with an accompanying resolution and submitted it to the Maryland Municipal League office: **Aberdeen, Bel Air, Berwyn Heights, Berlin, Betterton, Bowie, Cheverly, College Park, Forest Heights, Frederick, Fruitland, Greenbelt, Hampstead, Landover Hills, Laurel, Millington,**

Morningside, Mt. Rainier, Port Deposit, Preston, Riverdale Park, Salisbury, Sykesville, Takoma Park, Upper Marlboro, and Walkersville. Urban Waters Small Grants Available

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is soliciting proposals from eligible applicants for projects that will advance EPA's water quality and environmental justice goals. Proposed projects will address urban runoff pollution through diverse partnerships that produce multiple community benefits, with emphasis on underserved communities. Note that proposed project activities must take place entirely within one of the Eligible Geographic Areas, as illustrated on the interactive map provided on the Urban Waters Small Grants mapping [website](#).

EPA supports and empowers communities, especially underserved communities, that are working on solutions to address multiple community needs, and fostering successful collaborative partnerships. Projects should address local water quality issues related to urban runoff pollution; provide additional community benefits; actively engage underserved communities; and foster partnership.

The total estimated funding available for awards under this competition is approximately \$1.6 million. EPA expects each award to range from \$40,000 to \$60,000. EPA Regional Offices will award the cooperative agreements resulting from this announcement. It is anticipated that each EPA Regional Office will award approximately two to three cooperative agreements. Funding is contingent upon Agency funding levels, the quality of proposals received, and other applicable considerations.
