CITY OF COLLEGE PARK WINTER ALERT! SNOW & ICE REMOVAL

Property owners, occupants and merchants are reminded of the City requirement to remove accumulated snow and ice from all walkways, driveways, parking lots and other areas used by pedestrians or automobiles.



The owner or occupant of any property that abuts the sidewalk must clean public sidewalks of ice, sleet and snow for their full width. It is required that snow and ice be removed within the first eight (8) hours of daylight after snowfall stops. These requirements are listed under City Code Sections 157-6(B)(10) and 141-5(A).

Though City code enforcement officers may not cite all such violations immediately after a storm, failure to comply with this regulation in a timely manner could be used as evidence by anyone injured in a fall on or adjacent to your property if you are sued for such injuries.

Be prepared! Keep snow shovels and salt ready for the next storm, and plan to have help available if necessary to make your walkway safe as soon as the snow stops falling.



LEAF COLLECTION PROCEDURES

DO:

- Rake leaves, grass, flowers, and light clippings to the curb (but not in the street) - you do not need to bag these items
- Pile leaves away from cars and storm drains – piles blocked by obstacles will not be collected
- Watch for the posted signs in your neighborhood to know when to rake your leaves to the curb. Visit the website for updates to the collection schedule.

DO NOT:

- Include brush, branches, sticks, bamboo, vines, rocks, or debris (trash) in your leaf piles. These items may damage the leaf vacuums and delay collection.
- Use plastic bags for leaves and clippings. You also do not need to use paper bags or reusable containers during curbside leaf vacuum collection.
- Block storm drains or fire hydrants, as this can lead to storm water and emergency access problems.
- Pile leaves in the street. Leaves in the street can create a slipping hazard, parking problems, and clog storm drains.

RECYCLING HOLIDAY LIGHTS

My Organic Market (9827 Rhode Island Avenue; 301-220-1100; www.momsorganicmarket.com) is accepting your old incandescent holiday lights for recycling. Bring in your strings of holiday lights (do not include boxes or packaging) and receive a coupon for 15% off the purchase of LED holiday lights from HolidayLEDs.com (www.holidayleds.com).

ARE YOU RECYCLING THIS HOLIDAY SEASON?

The holidays are busy for everyone, but here are some things to keep in mind to recycle correctly, and some tips to reduce your waste:

Reduce Waste:

- Choose gifts and food items with less packaging and buy in bulk when possible.
- Avoid using disposable dishes and cutlery; a little extra work to clean reusable cookware and dishes makes a big difference by keeping

these items out of the landfill. Compost food scraps (not meat or dairy) in the backyard.

- Use rechargeable batteries for electronic items.

Reuse:

- Reuse gift wrap, packaging, and decorations. Make gift tags out of magazine clippings, old business cards, greeting cards, or photographs. Use outdated maps, comics, or newspaper sections as gift wrap.
- Hinged, clamshell containers are NOT recyclable by the City, but they make great gift boxes!
- Be creative - wrap a gift in a tea towel, apron, flower pot, or reusable shopping bag. Check out second hand shops for interesting tins, containers, jars, or picture frames to incorporate with your gift.
- Please consider donating old or unwanted (but still in good/working condition) clothing and other items; there are many charitable organizations that will accept what you no longer need. For assistance in locating an organization, please check your Resident Information Guide (pg. 19), or call the Recycling Coordinator at 240-487-3590.

Recycle:

- Cardboard boxes and other cardboard/paperboard packaging should be flattened and placed in the blue recycling cart with other recyclable materials. If boxes are too large to fit in the cart, please flatten and place them underneath cart so the cardboard does not blow away.
- Paper – non-metallic paper gift wrapping, gift boxes, greeting cards, envelopes, catalogues, and other paper items. Please remove ribbons and bows as these are not recyclable.
- Plastics – wide or narrow-neck containers (with triangle & #1-7 on side); rigid plastics, shopping bags (tied in 1 bag), etc. Please do not include hinged/clamshell containers, plastic bags/film, foam products or packaging, or items that are heavily contaminated with food residue or grease.
- Glass – bottles and jars (brown, clear, and green only)
- Metal – Aluminum/bi-metal cans, foil and baking pans (clean!)

REUSE and RECYCLE FOAM! Foam can be recycled in the following ways:

- The City of College Park is accepting molded #6 EPS for recycling during the April and October Clean-up Events ONLY. Contact the Recycling Coordinator at 240-487-3590 or publicworks@collegeparkmd.gov for more information.
- Packing peanuts can be recycled at College Park Shipping & Mailing (4423 Lehigh Road, College Park; 301-699-0191) or most UPS stores. Please visit <http://www.theupsstore.com> for locations.
- Molded #6 expanded polystyrene (EPS) foam packaging is accepted by the Alliance of Foam Packaging Recyclers (1298 Cronson Blvd. Suite 201, Crofton, 21114; 410-451-8340; www.epspackaging.org).

Remember that the following items are not recyclable by the City and should be placed in your trash cart: food scraps, plastics without a triangle and number 1-7 (such as utensils and plates), Styrofoam® cups, plates and trays, wax paper, paper napkins and towels, and any container with a lot of food waste. Please rinse food containers out before putting them in your recycling cart – this will help reduce bad odors and keep pests away.

PARK ON THE EVEN SIDE WHEN IT SNOWS TO HELP US PLOW!

Public Works crews plow and salt City streets and parking lots to clear snow and ice.



Things you can do to help include:

- Move parked cars off the street so the snow plows can clear snow to the curb.
- If off-street parking is not available during predicted snowstorms, park on the EVEN side of the road (EXCEPTION: if your address is odd-numbered and the area across from your house is undeveloped, park on the odd side of the street)
- The City is not responsible for clearing snow from driveways or driveway aprons - this is the resident's responsibility.
- Be aware that the City begins plowing when snow reaches, or threatens to reach, 2-inch depths and will continue until well after the snow stops, making sure the roads are as clear and safe as possible. This means that your driveway may become accumulated with snow more than once as the trucks continue to plow. If you begin to remove snow before the trucks are finished, be mindful that your driveway may need to be cleared more than once.
- Clear snow and ice from the sidewalks in front of your residence. **THIS INCLUDES STORMDRAINS!** The City is responsible for clearing the streets; residents should work together to help keep storm drains clear.

- Have patience: crews work around the clock during snow emergencies to clear the streets. Although your street may not be plowed as quickly as you would like, our crews will make their way to you. Your patience is appreciated during these times.

Always plan to set your refuse and recycling carts out for your regularly scheduled day during snow events. Refuse and recycling collections may occur later in the day than normal, but you should not expect collections to be delayed until the following day.
