

MINUTES
Special Session of the College Park City Council
Tuesday, April 3, 2007
11:10 P.M.

PRESENT: Mayor Brayman; Councilmembers Milligan, Catlin, Perry, Fellows, Stulich, Hampton and Cook.

ABSENT: Councilmember Krouse.

ALSO PRESENT: Joe Nagro, City Manager; Karen Ruff, City Attorney; Janeen Miller, City Clerk; Sara Imhulse, Assistant To The City Manager; Terry Schum, Director of Planning.

During the regularly scheduled Worksession of the College Park City Council on April 3, 2007, a motion was made by Councilmember Fellows and seconded by Councilmember Hampton to enter Special Session. The Special Session was requested because County legislation that the City deems important was brought to the Council's attention today, and the hearing is tomorrow. The motion passed 6-1-0 (Perry opposed).

Action Items:

07-G-43 To Take A Position On CB-5-2007 (An Ordinance Amending The Development District Standards For The D-D-O Zone Under Certain Circumstances) And To Authorize Staff To Represent The City's Position At The Hearing On April 4.

A motion was made by Councilmember Cook and seconded by Councilmember Catlin to take the following position on CB-5-2007, and to authorize Staff to represent this position at a County hearing being held tomorrow. The City Council wishes to stand in opposition to the bill, and requests more time to understand its implications. If the County Council moves forward with the bill over this objection, the City requests that the following checks and balances be put into place: requiring mandatory referral to municipalities when the zone is within or adjacent to the municipality, and, if the municipality objects to the change, then a supermajority vote of the District Council would be required to approve such change.

There were no comments from the audience on this item. There were no comments from the Council.

The motion passed 7-0-0. Terry Schum was authorized to attend the hearing tomorrow morning to represent this as the City's position.

Adjournment: At 11:12 p.m., on a motion by Councilmember Perry and seconded by Councilmember Fellows, the Special Session was adjourned by a vote of 7-0-0.
