**Ordinance 10-O-09**  
**An Ordinance Of The Mayor And Council Of The City Of College Park, Maryland,**  
**Amending Chapter 184 “Vehicles And Traffic”, Article III “Parking Regulations” By**  
**Repealing And Reenacting §184-6 “Definitions” And §184-8, “Permits Required For Certain**  
**Vehicles” To Clarify The Definitions Of Public Street and Prohibited Vehicles.**

**PRESENT:** Mayor Fellows; Councilmembers Nagle, Wojahn, Catlin, Perry, Stullich, Afzali and Mitchell.

Mayor Fellows called the Public Hearing to order at 7:30 p.m. Bob Ryan gave an overview. This proposed ordinance would allow large (over ¾ ton) personal-use vehicles that are currently prohibited because of their size to park on a City street. It clarifies the prohibitions for certain commercial vehicles and makes the rules consistent between what is allowed to park on private property and what is allowed to park on the street. It also allows special exceptions to be granted by the City Manager for up to 24 hours and by the City Council for longer periods of time.

**Comments from the audience:**

**Jack Robson, 4710 Harvard Road:** He raised questions about personal vehicles with dual rear wheels and about unlicensed motor scooters.

Ms. Ferguson said the City Code regulates where motor vehicles are allowed to park and might not address the unlicensed motor scooters referenced by Mr. Robson. She will look at the definition of motor vehicles in the City Code.

Councilmember Stullich suggested this might be something for the Council to consider in the future.

Student Liaison Lurie said the University of Maryland is now addressing registration and parking issues for motor scooters.

There being no testimony, Mayor Fellows closed the Public Hearing at 7:43 p.m.
